WHEREAS; Wisconsin's 29 commercial ports play an increasingly important role in the state's economy and overall quality of life, and, each year, our ports handle more than 30 million tons of cargo which generates more than \$1.6 billion in economic activity and almost 10,000 jobs; and

WHEREAS; moving bulk commodities – iron ore, wood pulp, agricultural goods, coal, salt, and cement – by water is extremely efficient and environmentally friendly, and Wisconsin's modern port facilities serve as distribution centers linking cargo-carrying vessels with our extensive transportation network of highways, railroads, and airports; and

WHEREAS; the waterways surrounding Wisconsin provide recreational opportunities and are an important part of tourism in the state with charter fishing boats, sport fishing, commercial, and six passenger ferries; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Commercial Ports Association is working with the University of Wisconsin and others to leverage Wisconsin's comparative advantage in marine freight transportation, and is hosting its annual meeting in Green Bay from August 21 - 22, 2014;
