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Petroleum product shipments contribute to strong July at Port of Green Bay

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(Green Bay, WI) Compared to this time last year, tonnage at the Port of Green Bay is up one percent. Over 817,200 tons have already been shipped this season through the Port of Green. In July alone, approximately 235,800 tons were shipped, with a significant amount of the cargo being petroleum products.

“Though one percent might sound insignificant, it is a measurement of growth and a strong shipping season so far,” explained Port Director Dean Haen. “Petroleum products, in particular, have been an incredibly high source of tonnage in both imports and exports. That reflects a trend in overall Saint Lawrence Seaway traffic where petroleum shipments are up 34.7 percent this year. Shipment numbers are especially high in Green Bay due to the main pipeline between Milwaukee and Northeast Wisconsin being shut down indefinitely.”

During the month of July, wood pulp was imported to the Port of Green Bay for the first time since 2008. The Arubaborg, sailing under the flag of Netherlands, carried wood pulp from Brazil to the Port of Green Bay.
