



Cement, Coal Shipments Keep Port Moving

(Green Bay, WI) – Strong imports of cement and coal were the main contributors to the tonnage increases through June at the Port of Green Bay. Tonnage numbers for the season so far total 706,000 metric tons, a four percent increase when compared to the same period a year ago.

Through June 30, the Port has imported nearly 167,000 metric tons of coal, up 69 percent from 2014. About 142,000 metric tons of cement also made its way through the Port, a 75 increase for the season thus far. Salt was also up nine percent, with a year-to-date total of 47,300 metric tons.

Timing has a lot to do with increases in tonnage so far, but Port Director Dean Haen anticipates that will level out as the season progresses. “We are happy to be ahead of last year’s pace,” said Haen. “The economy is good, materials are moving, so there is good reason to believe we will be able to meet last year’s tonnage total.”
