



Port of Green Bay tonnage continues to outpace last year

(Green Bay, WI) – The 2019 shipping season at the [Port of Green Bay](#) is continuing its strong start with a very productive month in May. A total of 265,600 tons were moved in and out of the Port in May, which led to overall tonnage being up 21% from this time last year.

The main contributors to the increase were salt and petroleum products, along with an increase in coal. Domestic coal imports are up 22% over 2018, and salt foreign imports up 61%. Foreign exports of petroleum products increased, up 190% over last year, and foreign imports are also up by 20%.

“In April, we moved over 168,500 tons, which was a great kick-off to the season; but May saw tonnage increase over that number by more than a third,” explained Port Director Dean Haen. “High water levels are allowing single ships to carry more tonnage than usual. For each additional inch of water in the Port of Green Bay, another 100 tons of cargo can be added to ships importing or exporting important commodities.”
